



## Learn about the fishes of the Ganaraska region

**PORT HOPE** - The Ganaraska Region Conservation Authority (GRCA) watersheds contains over 40 species of native and introduced species of fish. These including species supporting significant recreational fisheries and popular fish viewing opportunities at places like Corbett's Dam. Both the fishery and fish viewing attract people from outside of Northumberland County, as far away as Quebec, Ottawa, and Toronto.

Each one of these species has unique life history and behavioural traits that have developed over time, allowing them to thrive within each watershed. For example, certain species of minnows will carry pebbles in their mouth to build a spawning mound, or eel's that will migrate to the Sargasso Sea (Bermuda Triangle area) to spawn!
