



Quick Updates On the Ganaraska Forest Closure

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE, October 7, 2022 (Port Hope, ON) – Due to ongoing safety concerns, and evolving salvage and harvesting locations in the Ganaraska Forest, the Ganaraska Region Conservation Authority (GRCA) will be continuing to limit trail access to Forest users with current and extended memberships only until further notice.

Current Single Track Conditions

Single-track has been closed due to safety concerns, which has emphasized the importance of the GRCA working with our partners to improve upon and build a sustainable trail system for the future.

Central Forest Closure

Due to logging operations and trail clearing efforts, there are currently no connected trail systems that start and end at the two designated Central Forest access points—Ganaraska Forest Centre Trail Head and a Horse Trailer Parking Lot. Trails will progressively reopen as they become safe to do so.

The continued understanding and patience of Forest users is very much appreciated. Your cooperation is the best course of action the GRCA could ask for. We are continuing to work with members but would like to remind you to bring your passes, old or new, as long as they are eligible for an extension.

Ganaraska Forest memberships (except for cross country ski memberships) purchased between June 1, 2021 and May 21, 2022 will receive an automatic 1 year extension. We are working to get updated passes to all members as quickly as possible.

Day passes and memberships are currently not available for sale.
