 - to draw, accept, sign, make, endorse, negotiate and dispose of all or any bills of exchange, promissory notes, evidence of indebtedness, cheques and orders for the payment of money, and
 - b) to pay and receive all monies and given acquittance of the same, and
 - to borrow money (whether by way of overdraft or otherwise, howsoever), from the Bank of Montreal and deposit with, convey, transfer, mortgage, pledge, hypothecate, assign, deliver, borrowed all or any of the present or future property and assets of the organization of every kind and whether real or person, movable or immovable, and
 - d) to receive from the Bank any negotiable instruments or property and assets of the organization of every kind and given receipts therefore, and
 - e) to execute any agreement with or authority to the Bank relating to the banking business of the organization either generally or with regard to any particular transaction, and
 - f) to transact generally with the Bank any business he/she may see fit.
- 2. **ALSO THAT** the CAO/Secretary-Treasurer of the Ganaraska Region Conservation Authority **and** one of the Chair or Vice-Chair are hereby authorized for and in the name of the organization from time to time until further notice to the Bank:
 - a) to discount, negotiate, deposit with or transfer to the Bank (but for credit of the account of the organization only), all or any bills of exchange, promissory notes, cheques or orders for payment of money and other negotiable instruments and for the said purposes to endorse the same or any of them, and
 - b) to receive all paid cheques and other debit vouchers charged to any account of the organization and given receipts therefor.

WHEREAS it may be necessary for the Ganaraska Region Conservation Authority (hereinafter called the "Authority") to borrow the sum of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00) required for its purpose until the payment to the Authority of any grants and of sums to be paid to the Authority by the participating municipalities designated as such under the Conservation Authorities Act, 1980 as amended.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED:

- 1. That the Authority do borrow from the Bank of Montreal the sum of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00) necessary for its purpose on the promissory note or notes of the Authority until payment to the Authority of any grants and of sums to be paid to the Authority by the participating municipalities at such rate of interest as agreed to by the Authority and the Bank of Montreal.
- 2. That the Chair or Vice-Chair together with the CAO/Secretary-Treasurer of the Ganaraska Region Conservation Authority be and they are hereby authorized to execute for and on behalf of the Authority a promissory note or notes for the sum to be borrowed under paragraph 1 hereof and to affix thereto the Corporate Seal of the Authority.
- 3. That the amount borrowed pursuant to this resolution together with interest be a charge upon the whole of the monies received or to be received by the Authority by way of grants as and when such monies are received or to be received by the Authority from the participating municipalities as and when such monies are received.
- 4. That the Chair or the Vice-Chair or CAO/Secretary-Treasurer of the Ganaraska Region Conservation Authority be and is hereby authorized and directed to apply, in payment of monies borrowed pursuant to this resolution together with interest thereon, all of the monies received by the Authority by way of grants or sums received by the Authority from participating municipalities.

It is hereby certified by the undersigned that the forgoing resolution was duly passed at a meeting of the Ganaraska Region Conservation Authority held on the 16th day of February 2023 which a quorum of the members was present and that such resolution is in full force and effect.

RE: Application to WECI Program for Funds to Complete Engineering Assessment of Garden Hill Dam

Recent annual inspections of the Garden Hill Dam by GRCA staff in the fall of 2022 have revealed deterioration of the concrete wing walls on the upstream side of the structure. Additionally, the concrete seal/parging where the wing walls connect to the dam have begun to crumble. The northwest wing wall is exhibiting signs of minor movement, possibly caused by frost heave behind the wing wall. Staff is recommending that these issues be investigated through an external engineering assessment and have completed an application to the Water and Erosion Control Infrastructure (WECI) administered by the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry (MNRF). Staff have estimated that the assessment to cost \$10,000 and the application will be submitted by the deadline of February 17, 2023.

The WECI program has two project categories and funding allocation targets set as follows:

- 1. Repairs generally 80% of funding, includes major maintenance, safety projects, and removals
- 2. Studies generally 20% of funding

As the engineering assessment would fall into the 'Studies' category, it would be eligible for 20% of the study costs, or \$2,000. GRCA would be providing the remaining \$8,000 in funding, which would be reflected in the finalized 2023 budget to be presented to the Board in May.

The WECI program requires that projects must be completed in the fiscal year, April 1 to March 15, in which they are approved and funded. Decisions on funding applications are normally finalized by the WECI Committee in May. Should the application be successful, staff would initiate a 'request for proposals/quotes' process in June.

It is hoped that by undertaking assessment work this year, it will enable GRCA to confirm repair and budget requirements for next year so that the observed concerns can be addressed in the near future to help reduce maintenance costs in the long term.

Normally projects of this nature would be depicted in the budget and administered by staff however, the WECI application process requires that the application submission include a Conservation Authority Board

approval/resolution to provide confirmation of matched funding. As such, staff present the following recommendation for consideration of the Board.

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT the Ganaraska Region Conservation Authority support the application to the WECI program for funding to complete an engineering assessment of the Garden Hill Dam.
