#### STAFF REPORT – November 27, 2025

TO: Chair and Members of the Ganaraska Region Source Protection Authority

RE: Proposed Amendments (Section 36 updates) to the Ganaraska Source Protection Plan and Assessment Report

Section 36 of the Clean Water Act, 2006 provides a framework to ensure that Assessment Reports and Source Protection Plans remain current and effective. As scientific understanding, data availability, and policy frameworks evolve and as implementation experience highlights areas for improvement periodic updates are required to maintain strong protection of municipal drinking water sources.

On November 23, 2023, the Ganaraska Region Source Protection Authority received formal notice of the submission of the updated Assessment Report and Source Protection Plan under Section 36. These documents were submitted to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) in early December 2023 by the Trent Conservation Coalition Source Protection Committee.

The Ministry's review process took longer than anticipated due to initial concerns regarding proposed changes to Prescribed Instrument policies. The Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks requested the removal of proposed minimum requirements for Prescribed Instrument policies during their review. These requirements were intended to strengthen implementation of the Source Protection Plan, but the Ministry expressed concern that they would place too great a burden on MECP staff. Over the past several months, a revised approach was negotiated with the Ministry that maintains the original intent of the amendments while addressing their concerns, resulting in a mutually acceptable solution for submission. The final approval is anticipated in early January 2026.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**
