Working as part of the Ganaraska Region Conservation Authority's (GRCA) Conservation Lands team, the two Trail Inspectors will work together to inspect trails within the Ganaraska Forest while collecting data using mobile mapping applications. These positions work from the Ganaraska Forest Centre at 10585 Cold Springs Camp Road.

Application Criteria

1. This position is restricted to youth 15-30 years of age on the first day of employment.
2. Must be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act* for the duration of employment.
3. Must have a valid Social Insurance Number at the start of employment and be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial legislation and regulations.
4. Can be a returning student or recent graduate of a post-secondary program in environmental science, earth sciences, conservation restoration or a related discipline.
5. A valid Province of Ontario driver's license is required, and GRCA will obtain a 3-year uncertified driver's abstract of the successful candidate upon hiring.

Summary of Tasks

- Walk recreational trails in the Ganaraska Forest to undertake trail inspections.
- Inspection data collection using handheld data loggers and mobile devices.
- Work with ArcGIS Online Mobile applications to collect and review inspection data.
- Provide feedback to the supervisor regarding progress and any issues in the field.
- Clear trail blockages and support lands staff in trail maintenance.
- Requires some driving on recreational trails in the Ganaraska Forest.

Summary of Qualifications

- Progressing well toward a diploma from a recognized Community College or University in an Environmental field of study.
- A basic knowledge ESRI technologies including but not limited to ArcPro, ArcGIS Online, and ArcGIS Mobile mapping applications.
- Knowledge of recreational trail design and construction is an asset.
- Experience with hand saws, pruners and chainsaws is an asset.
- Applicants must have excellent communication, customer service, problem solving and organizational skills.

- The successful applicant must be able to adapt to an environment of change and work well independently as well as in a team environment.
- Applicants must be capable of physically demanding labour, and able to walk 5 kilometers or more a day.
- Applicants must be willing to work in all weather conditions.
- Able to supply safety work boots.
- A current criminal record check is required if successful.
- Must be able to work safely in accordance with the GRCA Health and Safety Policy.
